GRAVITY PRODUCES WAVES

Scientists have detected the gravitational ripples that were first predicted by Albert Einstein 100 years ago. These gravitational waves were the result of the collision of two massive black holes that took place over a billion light years away in the deep space. The discovery will usher in a new era in the research of the 'dark' side of the universe.

Immense amount of matter was converted into energy in a second, when the two black holes collided and spiralled into one another. The collision sent shock waves travelling across the space for over a billion years until they were picked up by the gravitational-wave instruments on Earth recently.

The gravitational waves are the first direct evidence of the pair of colliding black holes, which are so dense that they exert a gravitational force from which not even light can escape.

This direct detection of gravitational waves will now enable astronomers to look deeper into the universe and farther back in time. According to scientists, it now may even be possible to see the Big Bang!








1. We actually do not see with our eyes; we see with our brains. The eyes are basically the cameras of the brain. One-quarter of the brain is used to control the eyes.



1. HAFLONG

Haflong, a hill station in Assam, is also referred to as the land of 'blue hills'. The green valley and the hilly treks at Borai Hills are hotspots of adventure tourism events such as hang-gliding, paragliding and trekking.

2. Tawang Valley

The Tawang Valley, in Arunachal Pradesh, is a picturesque valley formed by the river of the same name. Situated in the valley, is the famous Tawang Monastery, perched on the spur of a hill, making it a popular tourist destination. The Nuranang Falls, which is located near the town of Jang and is 40 kilometres from Tawang town, is one of the spectacular waterfalls of Arunachal Pradesh. This waterfall is formed by the river Nuranang, which originates from the northern slopes of the Sela Pass. The pass at the elevation of 13,700 feet remains covered with snow for most part of the year.

3. Gurez

Gurez is considered to be one of the most picturesque valleys of Kashmir. Gateway to the ancient 'Silk Route', it is home to the famous pyramid-shaped 'Habba Khatoon' peak, which is named after a Kashmiri poetess. The beautiful Kishanganga River flows through the Gurez Valley.

4. Warwan Valley

The Warwan Valley is another lesser known place in Kashmir. The valley is at an altitude of approximately 7,000 feet from sea level and offers spectacular views of greenery, waterfalls and clear skies. It is bound by the Kashmir Valley on one side and Ladakh on the other side. On a moonlit night, one can enjoy the sheer beauty of the snow peaks of Zanskar Range and the Chenab River shimmering through the valley.

6. Lepchajagat



8 January 2016

India and France start their eight-day counter-terrorism and counter-insurgency joint exercise Shakti-2016 in Rajasthan.

9 January 2016

A total of 9,892 women participated in Nati folk dance in their traditional colourful Kulluvi on October 26, 2015 during the International Dussehra Festival making it to the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest folk dance in the world because of the sheer number of participants.



12 January 2016

- In a rare occurrence 45 dead, short-finned pilot whales wash ashore in Thoothukudi district of Tamil Nadu. As many as 36 whales were rescued in a joint operation by several government agencies and pushed back into the sea.
- The Supreme Court stays a January 7 notification issued by the Centre allowing *jallikattu*, despite the ban imposed by the court in 2014 on the sport, which it called 'inherently cruel'.
- **K**erala becomes the first state in the country to achieve 100 per cent primary education.

- The Coast Guards of India and Japan conduct their 15th joint exercise off the coast of Chennai. India's Coast Guard vessel 'Samudra Pehredar' and the Japanese vessel 'Echigo' take part in the bilateral training called Sahyog–Kaijin 2016.

15 January 2016

- At the 61st Filmfare Awards in Mumbai, Bajirao Mastani wins the most awards including the Best Film Award. Moushumi Chatterjee is awarded the Filmfare Lifetime Achievement Award for the year 2015.
- Sania Mirza and her Swiss partner, Martina Hingis, win the 2016 WTA Apia International Sydney title in the women's doubles category (tennis) in Sydney, Australia.

- The film *Titli* directed by Indian filmmaker Kanu Behl bags the Best First Foreign Film Award conferred by the French Syndicate of Cinema Critics 2016 (FSCC).

3 February 2016

- A major avalanche buries 10 soldiers under snow after their camp in the northern part of the Siachen Glacier is hit.
- The veteran Congress leader and former Lok Sabha Speaker Balram Jakhar (92) passes away.
- The Delhi government relents to the demands of the striking civic body employees by the announcement of the disbursal of nearly ₹ 700 crore including a loan of ₹ 551 crore.

4 February 2016

- Maharashtra Governor C. Vidyasagar Rao grants sanction to the CBI to prosecute former Chief Minister Ashok Chavan in the Adarsh Housing Society scam.

- Well-known cartoonist Sudhir Tailang (55), who was suffering from a brain tumour, passes away in New Delhi.
- On a two-day visit to Sri Lanka, the External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj expresses support for the island nation's reconciliation and development policies.

7 February 2016

- Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar rules out any troop withdrawal from the Siachen Glacier after the last week's avalanche claimed the lives of 10 soldiers.
- North Korea launches a long-range rocket in defiance of UN sanctions and just weeks after a nuclear bomb test.

13 February 2016

- The Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and the Congress decide to fight the upcoming Tamil Nadu Assembly elections together.
- Malayalam language and literature loses one of its most respected contemporary voices with the death of poet O N V Kurup (84) in Kerala. He was the recipient of the Jnanpith award and the Padma Vibhushan.
- Disappointed over a US decision to sell eight more F-16 fighter jets to Pakistan, India summons US Ambassador Richard Varma to the External Affairs Ministry to express 'displeasure' with the deal.



14 February 2016

Several political and film personalities, including Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, Amitabh Bachchan have a narrow escape when a fire breaks out on stage during a cultural programme at the 'Make in India Week' event at Girgaum, Chowpatty in Mumbai.

15 February 2016

- The Government plans to roll out a centrally sponsored Health Protection Scheme—a convergence of several current schemes to initially provide a minimum cover of ₹ 50,000 to around 40 crore people.
- President Pranab Mukherjee sacks Visva Bharati Vice-Chancellor Sushanta Duttagupta after a government panel found him guilty of misconduct and financial bungling.

17 February 2016

Director General (prisons) Alok Kumar Verma replaces B S Bassi as the New Delhi Police Commissioner.

18 February 2016

- The Supreme Court lifts its order to maintain status quo in Arunachal Pradesh, clearing the road for Governor J P Rajdhowa to recommend withdrawal of President's rule and for the formation of a new government of dissident Congress leaders backed by BJP MLAs.
- Army columns deployed at nine locations in Haryana and curfew is imposed in Rohtak and Bhiwani city limits with shootat-sight orders, after one person was killed in police firing as an agitation demanding reservation for Jats flared into violence.
- A few hours after President's Rule was revoked in Arunachal Pradesh, the dissident Congress leader, Kalikho Pul, sworn in as Chief Minister in the night.

19 February 2016

- Violence triggered by the Jat agitation for reservation spreads to more areas in Haryana with reports saying protesters set fire to vehicles and public and private property and blocked roads and the railway track. Four persons were reportedly killed and several injured in the State as security forces opened fire.
- US President Barack Obama signs into law a piece of legislation imposing new sanctions on North Korea for refusing to stop its nuclear weapons programme.

20 February 2016

Brendon McCullum blasts the fastest Test century to rescue New Zealand before Australia was reduced to 57 for one by the close of day one of the second Test match at

21 February 2016

- With militants taking the 'advantageous position' in the seven-storey Entrepreneurs Development Institute (EDI) at Sempora in Pulwama district of south Kashmir for over 28 hours, three Army personnel of the elite 9 PARA lose their lives while trying to storm the floor where the militants were holed up.
- Triple jumper Renjith Maheswary wins a silver medal to take India's medal tally to five in Asian Indoor Athletics Championships in Doha.

22 February 2016

All the three militants holed up in the five storey government building at Sempora district for more than 48 hours killed.

24 February 2016

Rohit Sharma's half century, Hardik Pandya's cameo and a disciplined performance by the bowlers help India register a 45-run win over Bangladesh in the Asia Cup opener in cricket in Mirpur.

25 February 2016

Railway Minister Suresh Prabhu effects no hike in passenger fares, indicates cut in freight tariffs, admits that the global economic slowdown is hurting India's core sectors and points out that the looming impact of the Seventh Pay Commission made it one of the toughest times to formulate a Budget.

26 February 2016

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi urges the state governments to give priority to agriculture even as he pledged to "double the income of farmers" by 2022, to mark India's 75 years of independence.
- With a series of Assembly polls coming up, BJP turns its spotlight on the rural and farm sectors in the Union Budget 2016–17 presented in the Parliament.

29 February 2016

A double suicide bombing claimed by ISIL kills about 70 people in a Shiite section of the capital Baghdad, marking it the deadliest attack inside the city this year.

- A Delhi court remands Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) students Umar Khalid and Anirban Bhattacharya, facing sedition charges in connection with a controversial event organised in JNU campus, in judicial custody for 14 days.
- The Delhi High Court grants JNUSU President Kanhaiya Kumar interim bail for six months in a sedition case registered against him in connection with a controversial event organised in the university.

2 March 2016

An undersea quake of magnitude 7.9 hits Indonesia sending panicked residents of the city rushing from their homes.

3 March 2016

Martin Crowe (53), the former New Zealand cricket captain, dies of cancer.

4 March 2016

7 March 2016

- Eighty-seven Indians, mostly fishermen, are handed over to India at the Wagah border after being released from prison. They were arrested in Pakistan for alleged territorial violation.
- Russian tennis star Maria Sharapova is notified by the International Tennis Federation (ITF) that she tested positive for a banned substance at the Australian Open in January.

8 March 2016

- Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley announces the withdrawal of the budget proposal on taxing Employees Provident Fund, following a backlash by several political parties.
- The sixth edition of T20 World Cup kicks off with a match between Zimbabwe and Hong Kong in Nagpur.



9 March 2016

Legendary British music producer George Martin (90) of the Beatles fame, passes away.

10 March 2016

Giving the go-ahead for the three-day World Culture Festival, to be organised on the fragile flood plains of the Yamuna, the National Green Tribunal asks the Art of Living Foundation to pay a fine of Rs 5 crore before the start of the event on March 11.

11 March 2016

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi attends the World Culture Festival, organised by the Art of Living (AOL) Foundation, led by Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, despite environmental controversy and unexpected rains.
- Air passengers will now get a higher compensation in case of death, injury, lost baggage or inordinate delay in flights as per the new Carriage by Air (Amendment) Bill passed by the Parliament.

- The Maharashtra Assembly unanimously suspends All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) MLA from Mumbai, Waris Pathan, accusing him of disrespecting the country, after he said he would not chant 'Bharat Mata ki Jai' even at the cost of his life.
- A bomb explodes inside a bus carrying government employees in Peshawar killing at least 17 people.

- In a setback to Punjab, the Supreme Court orders maintenance of status quo on the land meant for the Sutlej-Yamuna Link canal after Haryana alleged that attempts have been made to alter its use by levelling it.

18 March 2016

- The Congress rule in Uttrakhand suffers a setback as nine of its legislators rebel and join 28 BJP MLAs who staked claim to form a new government.

19 March 2016

A day after the JNU students Umar Khalid and Anirban Bhattacharya were released on interim bail, a Delhi court grants bail to the former Delhi University lecturer SAR Geelani, arrested on sedition charges in connection with a controversial event organised at Press Club of India in New Delhi on February 10.

A FlyDubai passenger jet crashes in southern Russia killing all 62 people on board, as it tried to land in bad weather in Rostov-on-Don.

- H S Prannoy clinches his second Grand Prix Gold badminton tournament title by notching up a straight-game victory over Marc Zwiebler of Germany in the summit clash of the Swiss Open.
- S S P Chawrasia wins the \$1.66 million Hero Indian Open golf title in New Delhi.

22 March 2016

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi makes it clear that his government has no plans to revisit the reservation policy for Dalits and other communities.
- To mark World Tuberculosis Day (March 24), Health Minister J P Nadda launches Bedaquiline—new drug for Drug Resistant TB—as a part of the national programme.
- President Obama and his family arrive in Cuba. It is the first time a sitting US President has visited the island nation since 1928.



26 March 2016

- The Speaker Govind Singh Kunjwal of Uttarakhand disqualifies nine Congress MLAs who had joined their BJP counterparts to dislodge the Harish Rawat government.
- President's Rule imposed on Uttarakhand, a day before the Harish Rawat government is to face a test of strength in the Assembly, which has been placed under suspended animation.

27 March 2016

About 65 people killed and more than 200 injured when a suicide bomb rips through the parking lot of a crowded park in Lahore where Christians were celebrating Easter Sunday.

28 March 2016

• Indians in distress will soon be able to get help using a single number '112' for all emergency services in the country, including the police, fire brigade and ambulance.

March 2016

• Kangana Ranaut picks up the Best Actress award for *Tanu Weds Manu Returns* and Amitabh Bachchan picks up the Best Actor Award for *Piku* at the 63rd National Film Awards.

29 March 2016

- The Uttarakhand High Court's order directing the State Assembly to hold a floor test to ascertain the majority of ousted Chief Minister Harish Rawat is perhaps the rarest instance of such an interim relief being granted while the legislature is under suspended animation.
- The Haryana Assembly passes the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Bill, 2016, to provide reservation for Jats and five other communities in government jobs and education.

30 March 2016

- Kingfisher Airlines Chairman Vijay Mallya offers to pay banks ₹ 4,000 crore as partial settlements of the carrier's debts and indicates to the Supreme Court that the atmosphere in India was too vitiated for him to immediately return.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi leaves for Brussels for the first leg of his three-nation tour of Belgium, United States and Saudi Arabia



31 March 2016

About 21 people killed and 88 injured as two parts of an under-construction 2.2-km-long Vivekananda Flyover collapsed in a congested market area in Burra Bazar, north Kolkata. The Army was called in for the rescue work.
